

## **Underpainting I: An Introduction to Underpainting**

Beginning a painting with an underpainting adds dimension and vibrance to a painting. With so many underpainting options available, it is an exciting adventure to experiment with the process. This one-day workshop provides an introduction to a variety of underpainting techniques for paintings. These introductory underpaintings can be used for painting with pastel, oil, or acrylic.

After preparing 4 underpaintings during the morning, the afternoon will focus on pairing these underpaintings with scenes and beginning to create a dynamic painting.



### THE GALLERY FRAME SHOP

#### WHAT WIDTH SHOULD THE MAT BE?

On average I like a 2" mat around the image. It could be a floated image or an image in a window mat. I like this look as it separates the image from the frame just enough. The width of the mat is always a personal choice. However, it is a contemporary look to take a small image and give it an extra large mount and a wide frame. It is accepted to have the mat even be three times the size of the image. It's possible to even use a less expensive frame or a thinner frame with this look because the mat draws the attention and focuses your eye on the image. This framing method gives the image real impact. In art we like to think in groups of odd numbers. It's true when putting artwork together on your wall, too. Three makes a perfect grouping.

Mats are generally equal top, bottom and sides. However, weighting the bottom is a good look to counteract any illusion that the piece is top heavy. Weighting the bottom of the mat is also used if a brass name plate is used or the artist is signing a photograph that is mounted on the mat.
